



POMEROY SCHOOL VISIT

School Competition Coordinator William attended Mullan's farm in Stewartstown with Queen Elizabeth II Primary School, Pomeroy.

The visit marked the start of the P5-P7 classes Supply Chain Project in association with ABP Linden that will feature a range of activities and visits around the Agri-food sector. Their on farm experience included feeding Angus and Wagyu calves, to a questions and answers session with the farmer, local vet and animal nutritionist.

The visit to ABP Linden retail site in Dungannon gave the students an introduction to the red meat business. The morning started with a chat about the different careers that are available from the staff including head of engineering on site, the technical team, NPD and sustainability officers.

Next up was an examination of the different cuts & retail pack that are produced on site and matching them to the animal. There were plenty of questions when the students learned that everything from dog food, footballs, to make up and buttons are all by products of beef production.
